

# INTRODUCTION TO THE CONSTITUENT COLLEGES



## CHUNG CHI COLLEGE

Chung Chi College was founded in October 1951 by representatives of Protestant churches in Hong Kong to meet the need for a local institution of higher learning that would be both Chinese and Christian. The College aims to provide further education in accordance with Christian traditions so that its students can develop an open-mindedness along with a thorough understanding and appreciation of both Western and Chinese cultures. It also aims to develop good analytical and problem-solving skills to meet the challenges of society.

In 1956, the College moved to its permanent site in the Ma Liu Shui valley. Between 1959 and 1963, the College received the bulk of its funds from the government. In 1963, the College was incorporated as one of the three colleges of The Chinese University of Hong Kong. It has a Divinity School for the training of Christian ministers and also a Chaplaincy Office to promote religious activities, including Sunday worship services and Christian fellowship programmes.

To cultivate students' leadership and organisational skills, Chung Chi College always encourages students to take part in extracurricular activities organised by the College Students' Union, departmental societies, class societies, various interest groups, the non-residential hall student society, and student hostel associations. A variety of social, academic and cultural activities, such as the Chung Chi Tea House, the Tolo Nocturne - night-time get-togethers in hostels - and visits to specially selected organisations are available to students. Inter-departmental competitions, a round-the-campus run and the Thousand People Feast are organised for the College Founders' Day celebration every year.

Academic and cultural activities are regularly organised for both College students and staff. Apart from seminars and discussions on education and other topics, the College also hosts college life luncheon talks and annual education conferences. The Siu Lien Ling Wong Visiting Fellow Programme, launched in 1982,

invites overseas academics for short-term visits to the College in order to broaden the perspectives and horizons of students and staff. In 1996, the Centre for the Study of Religion and Chinese Society was established to promote interdisciplinary academic research among members of the College.

The College also has scholarships, awards and financial aid schemes for its students including scholarships especially for freshmen donated by College alumni and the College Board of Trustees. In 2009-10, about 560 scholarships and bursaries totalling HK\$5,592,900 were granted to College students.

Apart from academic pursuits, the College also emphasises the importance of non-formal education and runs a wide array of personal development programmes including "Exchange Programme", "Student Visitor Programme", "Outward Bound Training Programme", "Service-learning Programme", "Sung Sheung Hong Creativity Award", "Dreaming through Chung Chi Programme", "University YMCA-CCC Programme" and "Quality Activity Award Scheme". Moreover, the College Language Enhancement Programme was launched to improve students' proficiency in English and Chinese through activities such as language tables and seminars, immersion camps and language study abroad programmes while the Learning Arts Programme sponsors students to take arts courses and also hosts activities related to art appreciation. Every summer, the College organises cultural study trips to France and Germany and also the "Summer Study Abroad Programmes" which support students to attend summer schools in prestigious overseas universities.



A few learning centres with the purpose of meeting learning needs of students have been established by the College. The Integrative Basic Studies Resource Centre compiles information related to university education, and provides students with audio-visual facilities and equipment. The Multi-media Centre aims to enhance students' computer literacy, supplement the computer facilities of the University and provide students and staff with access to the latest information technology for research. The Tang Ngan Leng Centre for General Science Education was established with a vision to raise students' interest in and improve their knowledge of Science.

Thanks to more than 58 years of educational work, Chung Chi College now has more than 20,000 graduates. Alumni associations have been formed in major cities in the United States and Canada to strengthen the ties between alumni and their alma mater. The local alumni association and the College jointly organise a Mentorship Programme, and an Overseas E-mentoring Programme, to enrich students' life-experiences and widen their social networks. With a rich history, strong tradition of community spirit, a wealth of opportunity for growth, and a strong alumni network, Chung Chi College is committed to providing a well-rounded higher education for its students.

## NEW ASIA COLLEGE

New Asia College was founded in 1949 by Dr Ch'ien Mu and a group of scholars from mainland China. The College aims to preserve traditional Chinese culture and balance it with Western learning to ensure that students understand their cultural heritage and are capable of coping with the challenges of the modern world.

The College had a humble beginning, but soon gained public and private support both locally and overseas. Set up in 1959 as a grant College, it became one of the three founding colleges of The Chinese University of Hong Kong in 1963 and, in August 1973, moved to its existing campus in Shatin.

To enrich on-campus cultural and academic life, New Asia College organises scholarly visits and cultural activities throughout the year under a number of programmes, including the Ch'ien Mu Lecture in History and Culture, the Yu Ying-shih Lecture in History, the United Asia Finance Visiting Scholars Programme, the S. Y. Chung Visiting Fellows Programme and the Y. S. Hui Exchange Programme in Fine Arts. Renowned scholars are also invited to deliver academic and cultural talks during the College's bi-weekly assemblies and cultural dinners.

To enhance intercultural exchange and foster global understanding, New Asia College has established various short-term, one-semester and one-year exchange programmes with overseas institutions. Since 1993, for example, the New Asia College/Yale University Student Exchange Programme has served to enhance students' understanding of the social, cultural and scientific issues of the United States and Hong Kong. New Asia students may also take part in one-year or one-semester exchange programmes in Europe, the United States, Japan, Korea and mainland China.

The College has also launched a number of language enhancement programmes to further improve students'



proficiency in Chinese and English. These include social Putonghua workshops, social English workshops, Putonghua Tables, a summer Putonghua speaking camp, an English summer camp and intensive summer language courses held in the mainland and the UK. All of these activities have been well received by students over the years.

A wide variety of other activities is also available for students who seek to acquire a non-formal education during the long summer vacation. The Student Leadership Development Programme, for example, enables students to develop personal confidence and assertiveness skills. The Summer Japanese Language Programme provides a unique opportunity for students to attend an intensive Japanese course at Kyoto Sangyo University, followed by a study trip to other locations in Japan. Other summer programmes, including the New Asia/Yale Community Service Exchange, the New Asia College/Hunan University Summer Exchange Programme and Summer Internship Programme, provide students with opportunities for cross-cultural learning or internship training. The College actively supports students who wish to attend overseas summer programmes or conduct research projects, and many of them have obtained College subsidies from the Student Study Trip Scheme and the Summer Research Grant Scheme.

The College currently has about 2,800 students, about half of whom are accommodated in four student hostels that have a total capacity of 1,165. The College's Guaranteed One-year Residence Scheme, which was established in 2002, ensures that every student experiences hostel life.

A wide range of College scholarships, with an aggregate value of more than HK\$4.5 million, are awarded to students who exhibit outstanding academic performance, actively participate in community service and/or student activities, demonstrate significant improvement in their studies or experience financial constraints.

New Asia alumni remain an important part of the College, and many of them generously contribute their time to the Mentorship Programme, in which they share their valuable experience with students. Since 2003, New Asia has also organised reunion activities for alumni who graduated 30 years ago, thus allowing them to further strengthen their ties with the College.

## UNITED COLLEGE

United College was founded in 1956 through the amalgamation of five colleges: Canton Overseas, Kwang Hsia, Wah Kiu, Wen Hua and the Ping Jing College of Accountancy. In 1957, United College was incorporated under an ordinance with a board of

trustees as its governing body, and in 1963 it became one of the founding colleges of The Chinese University of Hong Kong.

With generous donations from the Hong Kong community, the College established an endowment fund in 1963 to provide an essential source of funding for student services and further development, and in December 1971 it moved to its present campus in Shatin.

In living up to its motto, “Make One’s Virtues Shine and Renew the People”, United College strives to serve the people of Hong Kong, mainland China and the world through integrative education, pastoral care, and the moral and spiritual enhancement of our students. We place strong emphasis on the issues facing Hong Kong and the development of our community’s future leaders. Many United College graduates have gone on to distinguished careers in Hong Kong’s political, economic, social and cultural arenas.

United College places strong emphasis on whole-person education, broadening the perspective of its students and enhancing their sense of social responsibility. Our Distinguished Visiting Scholar Lectures, Annual Workshop and College Assemblies provide intellectual stimuli to both students and staff. The Budding Scholars Exchange Programme, launched in 1989, provides a good opportunity for students to interact with their peers from universities around the world. The College also has exchange agreements with Williams College and San Diego State University in the US, Soka University in Japan, Oulu University in Finland and Sung Kyun Kwan University in South Korea. We established the Tien Chi Microcomputer Laboratory, then the first of its kind on the University campus, in 1985 and the Choi Koon Shum General Education Resource Centre in 1995. In addition to its Project for Promoting Bilingual Skills, the College launched a Language Enhancement Programme in 1996 to strengthen students’ language skills. This well-received programme provides training courses in both English and Putonghua. Students may further improve their language skills by participating in various language and cultural programmes, including overseas study trips.

A wide range of activities, including a Students’ Union and student interest groups, leadership training, social services and incentive schemes, the United College Mr Fung Sun Kwan Whole Person Development Award Programme, the Shum Choi Sang Mentorship Programme, the Group Sense Innovation and Entrepreneurial Project Award Programme, the United College Toastmasters Club, organic farming and

environmental protection, drama, debates, arts and cultural activities, and health programmes, is organised throughout the year. Through participation in these activities, students develop and improve their personal and social qualities. To keep pace with globalisation, the College organises many exchange activities under the Globe-Oriented Active Learning (GOAL) Programme. Students are given opportunities to take part in overseas study tours and exchange programmes so that they can learn to live and interact with people from different parts of the world. Students can also make use of these scholarships to participate in overseas internship or study credit-bearing short-term courses offered by overseas universities.

The College offers a wide range of scholarships and awards for students who achieve outstanding performance in academic studies, sport and extracurricular activities. Scholarships are also available to allow eligible students to pursue postgraduate studies overseas. To broaden their international outlook, each year the College provides financial subsidies to around 370 students, enabling them to participate in overseas study trips and exchange programmes. To encourage students with financial difficulties to actively participate in college activities while studying, the College has offered a Hostel Residence Grant since 2007-08 to provide subsidies for hostel fees. In 2010-11, the total value of the College’s scholarships, awards and financial aid is approaching \$10 million, with more than two thousands awards.

The Dr Thomas Cheung Tutorial Scheme provides pastoral care to students and allows them to express their feelings, share their experiences and help one another in a tutorial setting as well as via the online forum. The College also promotes moral education through the Mr Shum Wai Yau Moral Education Scheme.

United College is situated on a beautiful campus graced with a cascade and artwork by celebrated artists. The College has also greatly expanded in the past few years. The Si Yuan Amenities Centre was completed in December 2001 and provides pub and karaoke facilities to University members. The Chan Chun Ha Hostel – the College’s fourth student hostel – was completed in August 2004. The Adam Schall Residence and Hang Seng Hall underwent major renovations and spatial re-organisation in the summer of 2007. The four student hostels can now accommodate 1,286 students. To ensure a smoke-free and environmentally friendly campus, United College carried out a campus improvement project in the summer of 2005. This project included the redesign of the landscaping, the relocation of the car park and a paving project, among other improvements. The Si Yuan Amphitheatre, an open-air, 350-seat arena designed to stage cultural activities, was opened on 15 September 2006.

## SHAW COLLEGE

Shaw College was established in July 1986 through the generosity of Sir Run Run Shaw, a world-renowned philanthropist who kindly accepted the invitation to become the patron of the College. The College is situated in the north-western part of the University campus overlooking Tolo Harbour.



The College motto, *xiude jiangxue*, is taken from a Confucian saying that highlights the cultivation of virtue and the pursuit of knowledge. The College slogan, “Excellence with a Soul, Leadership with a Heart”, echoes this motto. Shaw College views non-formal education as an integral and essential part of university life, and offers a wide variety of General Education courses, most of which are inter-disciplinary, with the aim of helping students to adjust to University life and to provide opportunities for experiential or service learning. College assemblies and high-table dinners also form part of the General Education programme. Prominent speakers or persons with special life experience are regularly invited to talk to students to help them broaden their horizons.

To expand their international exposure, students are encouraged to take part in semester- or year-long overseas exchange programmes organised by the College, the Office of Academic Links or various departments. Cross-cultural interaction is further enhanced by the provision of accommodation for both local and international students. The College also offers a variety of overseas summer and winter programmes to promote cultural exposure, language learning or service to the needy, as well as internship placements in mainland China and different parts of the world.

Under the Distinguished Visiting Scholars Scheme and the Sir Run Run Shaw Distinguished Visiting Scholars Programme, world-renowned scholars and experts are invited to deliver talks to students. Past speakers include Professor Lee Yuen-tseh, Nobel Laureate in Chemistry; Professor Yang Chen-ning, Nobel Laureate in Physics; Professor Yau Shing-tung, Recipient of the Fields Medal; Professor Andrew Chi-chih Yao, Medal Recipient of the A.M. Turing Award; Professor Zhong Nan-shan, head of the Institute of Respiratory Disease in Guangzhou; and Professor Charles Kao, Nobel Laureate in Physics and father of optical fibre. The College also organises the annual Shaw Prize Lectures with Shaw laureates from the fields of astronomy, the life sciences and medicine, and the mathematical sciences as speakers.

The College works hand-in-hand with student bodies to enrich campus life by organising different kinds of activities. Annual large-scale student events include the Orientation Camp, the ‘Shaw Lane’ evening bazaar, the College Founder’s Day celebrations and a singing contest, and there are also numerous extracurricular activities organised by the College’s many student societies, ranging from sports clubs, departmental societies and general interest clubs to the Rotaract Club and the Band Society. In recent years, the College has excelled in sport, and the sports teams have achieved many championships in inter-collegiate sports competitions. The College Drama Club and Debate Team have also performed remarkably in inter-collegiate and other contests.

In addition to recognising academic excellence, the College encourages students’ non-academic achievements and has established dozens of scholarships to reward active participation or outstanding performance in extracurricular activities, community service, sport or the possession of leadership and other special talents.

The College has a number of buildings and facilities that cater to the needs of staff and students. The renovated Lecture Theatre auditorium is ideal for seminars and activities, and Yueh Chiao



Art Gallery on the first floor of the theatre is frequently used for exhibitions. Newly renovated sports facilities include an indoor sports and multi-purpose hall, gymnasium, table tennis room and dancing room and outdoor tennis courts and a basketball/volleyball court. Others include Wen Lan Tang Administration Centre, Lam Kin Chung Computer Laboratory, Lee Woo Sing Hong Kong History Resource Centre, a multimedia laboratory and music rooms that feature the only band room on the CUHK campus. Kuo Mou Hall and Student Hostel II accommodate a total of 1,195 students. The dining facilities include a 175-seat student dining hall and a 112-seat staff dining room. Adjacent to Student Hostel II is the HERBSnSENSES Chinese Medicinal Plants Garden and a BBQ site. There is also an Alumni Trail lined with plaques engraved with the names of our graduates.

## MORNINGSIDE COLLEGE

Morningside College was formally established in May 2006 and will accept its first intake of students in the autumn of 2010. The College will be distinguished by its commitment to service and intellectual inquiry, distinctly international character and highly participatory nature. It aspires to become a model of excellence in the liberal arts tradition of undergraduate education.

The first class of students will number 80 and, at equilibrium, the college will accommodate 300 students. As is the case with residential colleges around the world, all Morningside students will reside and take their meals in the College, where they will be joined by College Fellows and distinguished visitors. Dinners will include frequent guest speakers from a broad range of professions and academic disciplines within the University and from the wider world.

Our vision for the College is that of a congenial community in which students live together and share the joys of learning, discovery and growth. We aim to help students to develop the values, intellectual breadth and practical skills needed to play leading roles in a wide range of disciplines and professions. We believe these goals can best be achieved in a college that is small by design.

The relatively small size of the College will allow for a level of intimacy among students and faculty and a style of learning that is only possible in a small, cohesive community. Students will take rigorous General Education courses in seminar

settings conducive to discussion, discursive writing and debate. These courses will be designed to sharpen students' intellectual acumen and equip them with the ability to engage in independent, reflective and critical thinking. Students will also be able to explore a rich offering of other academic and cultural activities, including student government, debates, community service, sport, theatre and music societies, and a number of activities that involve students from different continents.

Morningside College's student body will be diverse and highly international, with students drawn from Hong Kong, mainland China and other parts of the world, and from all academic disciplines within the University. A key characteristic of the College will be the high degree of student participation in its affairs. Students will be encouraged to be active builders, not merely consumers, of the College culture. Hence, we will look to them, and encourage them to look to one another, for ideas, inspiration and leadership in College activities. We will expect them to support and guide one another, and will ask them not only to identify problems within the College community, but also to seek solutions and resolve conflicts. Faculty Fellows and distinguished visitors from around the world who are in residence at the College will also contribute time, energy and thought to enriching College life.

A sense of social responsibility and engagement expressed both within the College and in community service activities is central to the Morningside ethos. All of our students will take an active part in community service activities throughout their university years. These and other activities will lead them to a deeper understanding of themselves and of how they can make a positive impact on the world.

Morningside College's international network of sister colleges will provide the starting point for academic and service exchanges that involve both the students and Fellows of the College. All Morningside students will participate in an international academic, cultural or service experience at some point in their years at the College.

Generous financial assistance is available to students in the form of scholarships, grants for service and international activities, and support for student societies and organisations.

The College campus is currently under construction, with completion expected in late 2010. It occupies a central location neighbouring the University Sports Centre, commands stunning views of Tolo Harbour and is within walking distance of the MTR University Station and various teaching, research and service facilities.

The College has received generous financial contributions from the Morningside Foundation and the Morningside Education Foundation for its establishment.

Throughout their undergraduate studies, all students live in one of two modern hostels and dine with the Master and other members of the College in three evenings each week.



## Mission and Motto

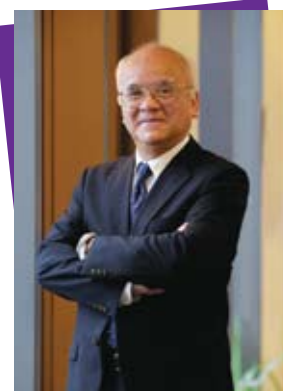
The mission of S.H. Ho College is to foster an intimate and congenial community in which students learn, share and grow intellectually. We aim to create an inspirational and multi-cultural and interactive learning environment for the students to receive pastoral care and whole-person education. Students will expand their horizon through General Education programmes, overseas experience, international exchange programmes, community service with the support of scholarships and bursaries if needed.

With the motto of "**Culture, Morals, Devotion and Trustworthiness**", S.H. Ho College aims at helping students to develop a refined appreciation of culture, high moral standards, and a strong sense of responsibility and integrity.

## College Master and His Vision

Professor Samuel Sun, Master of S.H. Ho College, is Emeritus Professor of Biology at CUHK and Director of the State Key Laboratory of Agrobiotechnology (CUHK). His research achievements won him international recognition, including being elected as a member of the Chinese Academy of Engineering. He was also conferred Honorary Fellowship of CUHK in 2010.

"My vision for S.H. Ho College is a "home" to students. This "home" is shared by professors and 600 students," said Prof. Samuel Sun, Master of S.H. Ho College, "Its members have diversified perspectives as a result of their professional backgrounds, ages, experiences and personalities. S.H. Ho College thus offers a diversified environment, which gives students stability, creativity, and freedom in the exchange of knowledge and ideas, so that they may grow in caring and friendly atmosphere full of hope and a sense of belonging."



## Multi-cultural Community

S.H. Ho College will be home to 450 students from Hong Kong, with the remaining 150 coming from mainland China and overseas. "Our College provides a fulfilling learning environment that lays the foundation for lifelong success. Yet our students will learn to see the College not only as their path to academic success but also as a home where they help people from different cultural and language backgrounds, understand and value each other," said Prof. Albert Leung, Dean of Students.

80% of the students of the College will gain overseas experience by participating in exchange programmes, summer language courses, summer study abroad programs, cultural visits and internship. The programmes will facilitate the students to develop social network, competent language skills and understanding of different cultures.

## Campus and Facilities

Close to CUHK's central campus, the College looks out over tranquil Tolo Harbour. A short walk from MTR East Rail, it is near most faculty and teaching buildings. Indoor and outdoor sports facilities are a few minutes away, as is the University Health Service. The two hostels, namely, Ho Tim Hall and Lee Quo Wei Hall, provide 300 hostel places each. Both hostels are expected to be completed by June 2011.

Besides its hostels, the College offers all the facilities needed for a rich collegiate experience: a multi-function hall; an auditorium; activity, fitness, reading and music rooms; an art studio; a multimedia exhibition corridor; and an outdoor performance area.

## Campus Location and design

CW Chu College is situated at Residence Lane between Wu Yee Sun College and Lee Woo Sing College. The main features of the new College will be three lowrise residential blocks built on a slope. The buildings will blend in with the slope, and roofed with greenery to achieve harmony with the lush, wooded hillside. The buildings will house, apart from living quarters for the undergraduates, dining facilities for the entire membership of the College, and purpose-built spaces for tutorials, seminars and other collegiate activities.

## WU YEE SUN COLLEGE

Wu Yee Sun College was established in 2007 with the very generous support from the Wu Yee Sun Charitable Foundation Ltd. It will provide board and lodging facilities for 600 students, and appropriate facilities and services for up to 600 non-residential students. The College is expected to commence operations by 2012.

The motto of the College is "Scholarship and Perseverance". In the College's intimate and dynamic learning atmosphere, students will develop the drive for entrepreneurship: a passion for innovation and creativity, and acumen in pursuing new projects and ideas, not just for personal gain but for the common good. Entrepreneurship with social responsibility and environmental



awareness is a central focus of the College. Through its diverse programmes of general education, college student life, and cultural and overseas exchanges, the College aims to broaden students' horizons (scholarship), and encourage them to forge ahead (perseverance) in making contributions to the society and leading a productive and rewarding life.

## Master-Designate – Professor Rance P.L. Lee
