2009-2010 Chairperson's Report of the Hong Kong Anthropological Society presented on 13 May 2010 by Stan Dyer

The Hong Kong Anthropological Society has held 11 talks and one jointly-organised seminar so far this year, as compared to 14 events by the AGM in May last year. Our talks this year were generally well attended, with average audience sizes of around 40.

There are two more talks scheduled this year. The first will be held on Thursday 17 June. The talk, by Eric Cheng Siu-kei, is entitled "Adopting a new lifestyle: Formation of a local organic community in Hong Kong". The second, by Christine Yau and entitled "Mainland Chinese as "Scapegoats" in Hong Kong today" will be held on Thursday 8 July.

The first of our talks this year, by Millie Creighton, was entitled "The Korean Wave and Japanese Fandom: Transforming Historic Tensions through Popular Culture".

The next, after the summer, was by Graeme Lang, who spoke on Energy and Culture: The Coming Reversal of Globalisation Trends in China. Chen Ju-chen spoke about "Peasants" in the history of urban development: Migrant Labourers in Beijing and emerging social divisions in late socialist China". Following that talk, Chen Yingjun spoke on "Maids in Shanghai" in November.

A seminar on religion, jointly-organised by HKAS and Shue Yan University was held at the Shue Yan campus in early December. For our last talk of 2009, Gordon Mathews spoke on "Asylum Seekers: The Paradoxes of Lives on Hold," a look at the current situation for asylum seekers in Hong Kong.

For our first talk in 2010, Ivette Vargas-O'Bryan presented her research in her talk Demon Diseases, Doctors and Monks: Taking Religion Seriously for Medicine. In February, John Whelpton spoke on Twilight of the Gods: the Demise of the Monarchy in Nepal.

In March, Valerie Wilson Trower spoke on The Fashion of Western Women in Hong Kong . Our talk in April was Living in the New Tibet: How Lhasa Residents deal with Modernisation by Kabir Mansingh Heimsath. Tonight's talk on Hong Kong Migrants in the Netherlands was given by Brevis Chan

The HKAS journal, *Asian Anthropology*, is flourishing and continues to gain the respect of anthropologists, both in Asia and worldwide. As well, a group of anthropology major students at the Chinese University of Hong Kong published this year's edition of the revived publication, *The Hong Kong Anthropologist*, which had formerly been the representative publication of the Society.

I am very appreciative of the efforts of the editors, Gordon Mathews and Sidney Cheung Chin-hung. This year, we received a very generous donation from City University through the efforts of our vice-chairperson, Graeme Lang, which helped considerably in our ability to support the publication of our journal.

Our membership continues to maintain a very healthy level with most members choosing to continue their membership via the convenient 3-year renewal method.
