

FULL-TIME UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES

Full-time undergraduate programmes applicable to students admitted in 2005-06 and thereafter are included in the ensuing chapters of this Student Handbook. For those programmes and study schemes applicable to students admitted in 2004-05 and before, please refer to Student Handbooks of previous years. Courses of each programme listed in this Student Handbook will be offered according to resources available each year. Students should also refer to the homepage of the Registration and Examinations Section <www.cuhk.edu.hk/rgs/> for information of course offerings in the current academic year.

Enquiries

Students must familiarize themselves with the General Regulations Governing Full-time Undergraduate Studies and/or the Regulations Governing Undergraduate Medical Studies/Regulations Governing Undergraduate Nursing Studies/Regulations Governing Undergraduate Studies in Chinese Medicine/Regulations Governing 4-year Full-time Undergraduate Studies in Education/General Regulations Governing 4-year Full-time Undergraduate Studies in English Studies and Education/Regulations Governing Undergraduate Studies in Law which stipulate requirements on course load, academic probation, leave of absence, graduation assessment, etc. Questions on registration, course selection, applications for change of Major Programme or period of study, registration and change of Minor Programme, leave and transcript may be directed to the Registration and Examinations Section. Students of the Faculty of Medicine should contact their Faculty Office.

Grade Review

Students who have any question on the grade given for any courses should consult the teacher(s) concerned within two weeks from the date of issue of the academic report for the term concerned. No appeal for grade review will be accepted after the specified period.

Course Code and Sequence

A course code is comprised of three alphabets, three numerals and one numeral/ alphabet. The first three alphabets stand for the subjects (e.g., CHI, ENG, BIO stand for Chinese, English and Biology respectively). The first numeral of undergraduate courses stands for the level of study. Undergraduate courses are coded 1 to 4 while postgraduate courses are coded 5 to 9. The numeric code starting with 0 stands for a course by student-orientated teaching.

Normally, lower-level courses should be taken before upper-level courses. However, for the sake of flexibility, most courses are open to students of all years of attendance subject to satisfactory fulfilment of prerequisite and corequisite requirements.
