

PART-TIME UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES OF STUDY

Curriculum Structure

At present, the University offers two part-time undergraduate programmes: Music and Primary Education.

The normal length of study of a part-time programme is five to six years, with three terms in each year. Secondary 6 and Secondary 7 entrants are required to complete before graduation at least 123 and 99 units of courses respectively. Apart from completing requirements of the Major subject, students are also required to take general education courses and/or elective courses in other disciplines.

Students who have satisfied the special entrance requirements of Music and Primary Education Programmes shall be granted an exemption of 43 or 63 units and are required to complete respectively at least 80 or 60 units of courses before graduation, depending on the specific category under which they are admitted.

Detailed study schemes of the part-time programmes are set out at the end of the course descriptions.

Starting from 1999-2000, all newly-admitted students are required to achieve a certain level of competence in IT. They are expected to pass the IT Proficiency test within their first year of attendance. If they pass, "IT Proficiency Passed" will be recorded on the transcripts; if they fail, they are required to attend summer intensive courses on IT.

Course Codes

To distinguish the part-time programmes from their full-time counterparts, "P" is used as the third alphabet in the course code. The other two letters are to stand for the subject (EPP for Primary Education and MUP for Music).
