## I. Guidelines for Organizing Sustainable O'Camps

The Chinese University of Hong Kong has always been committed to building an environment-friendly, sustainable campus, and, with the support of our students, significant achievements have been made. O' Camps provide good opportunities for new students to get to know our green campus and to play an active part in building a sustainable campus. Hence, the organizing committees of O' Camps and other students concerned are requested to take note of the following guidelines when planning for and organizing the O' Camps:

## **Energy Conservation & Carbon Reduction**

- Avoid energy wastage. Implement measures to minimize electricity use (e.g. by paying appropriate amount of AC credits, reminding freshmen to switch off electrical equipment when leaving rooms, etc.)
- Within campus, take the stairs instead of the lifts and walk instead of taking the shuttle buses as far as practicable.

#### Waste Reduction

#### Reduce

• *Garbage reduction!* Say 'no' to toys that are environmentally-harmful or create hard-to-clean garbage like: crackers with paper streamers, helium balloons, confetti and glitter.

- *Go electronic!* Use e-means for presentations at meetings. If documents must be printed, consider using recycled paper. Reduce handouts, use e-flyer for promotion and adopt e-registration.
- *Reusable dishware!* Where possible, request the caterer to provide reusable dishware and cutlery for meals.
- *Encourage participants to BYOB* (bring your own bottle) to minimize consumption of disposable bottled/individually packed beverages. There are many publicly accessible water dispensers or locations that offer free potable water. Check 'Guidelines for a Greener and More Sustainable Campus' below.
- **Smart ordering:** Check with the caterer prior to ordering meals to find out which dishes are most popular and less likely to generate leftovers; Also, as 'jobamas' may not have enough time to eat due to the packed schedule, some finger foods and fruits can be ordered instead of meals for easy takeaway.
- *No-show? Notify the caterer:* for pre-ordered catering, notify the canteen/caterer ASAP if attendance is lower than expected to avoid wasting food

## Reuse & Recycle

- *Adopt 3R Principle!* Lead freshmen in waste separation and recycling. Collect unwanted yet reusable items (e.g. excess souvenirs, banners, name badges, etc.) after O'Camp for reuse/donation/recycling. Check 'Guidelines for a Greener and More Sustainable Campus' below for collection locations.
- Avoid putting dates of events on banners so that they may be reused in the next O'Camp.
- For additional provision of recycling bins, please contact Mr. Lau of Estates Management Office (3943 4049) 1 2 weeks in advance.

#### **Water Conservation**

• No water-flinging in campus during pre-O' Camp and O' Camp.

## **Noise Control**

• For night-time events, keep noise at a minimal level to avoid undue disturbance to other residents on campus and in nearby villages.

## **Green Purchasing**

- *Go minimal!* Limit the distribution of gifts/souvenirs and keep the production of event-specific T-shirt to the minimal, for example, producing one T-shirt for each freshman only and not providing T-shirts to VIPs and student counsellors, and producing only one model of T-shirt for O'Camp. Wash T-shirts during O'Camp to reuse them.
- *Skip the packaging!* Buy individually wrapped food/supplies only when necessary.
- For the O'Camp's dining options, order dishes with less meat and more vegetables to reduce the carbon footprint of food consumed.
- Avoid unsustainably-harvested/farmed food. (Please refer to the 'Sustainability-Conscious Food Consumption 'under 'Policies related to Sustainability and Environmental Protection' in the Undergraduate Student Handbook)

## II. Resources and Guidelines for Freshmen

The student counsellors in O'Camp are requested to introduce to new students the following resources for living a greener lifestyle on campus and also guidelines for environmental protection and sustainability:

#### a) Vision and Commitment of CUHK

The University drew up its 'Environmental Policy' as early as 2000, and has since developed numerous policies (including 'Sustainability Policy' in 2012) for environmental protection and sustainability.

CUHK is the first, and so far the only, university to have won the HKAEE gold award twice, setting a pioneering example for sustainability in the academia. These awards testify to the collective efforts and achievements of our staff and students over the years.

#### **Reduction of Carbon Emissions**

Electricity being the major source of carbon emissions on campus, energy conservation is our primary task in reducing carbon emissions and combating global warming. #### **Waste Reduction**

As Hong Kong's three major landfills are nearing capacity, the 3R principle - "Reduce, Reuse and Recycle" - has an immediate role to play.

As a socially responsible institution, the University has implemented numerous measures for reducing waste. Recycling bins are provided at various points on campus to collect paper, plastics, aluminum cans and other resources. Students' support and initiatives are, however, the key to success.

## Actions recommended

## Reduce

- *Go electronic and paperless!* The University encourages e-communication. If documents must be printed, print on both sides to minimize paper consumption.
- Minimize waste! Buying new items only when necessary.
- Avoid food waste! Ask for "less rice/noodles" when dining in canteens.
- *Bring Your Own!* For take-away, bring your own container and cup to reduce the use of disposables. Refill your bottle at publicly accessible water dispensers:
  - On Campus: refer to the CUHK Mobile App's water dispenser map.
  - In Hong Kong: some online maps and apps like 'Water for Free' show water dispensers and locations that offer free potable water.

## Recycle and Reuse

- Separate waste and recycle as much as possible and give away unwanted but usable
  materials. For recycling / giveaway locations, see the 'Location of Recycling Facilities in
  CUHK Campus' in Related Resources; also, locations of outdoor recycling bins on campus
  are available in the CUHK mobile app's campus map under Facilities> Living Essentials>
  Recycling Bins (Outdoors).
- Separate food waste after meals to facilitate the food waste recycling
