1. Project objectives

This project is on track to meet its objectives at producing three micro-module teaching videos used as a part of flipped classroom teaching in the course "Interpersonal Violence" (UGEC2680/SOWK2200). The production of three micro-modules were interviewed with the victims/ survivors and person involved the three chosen types of interpersonal violence, including "Surviving from the Intimate Partner Violence", "Child Abuse", "Sexual Violence and Interpersonal Violence in Conflict Zone".

The micro-modules were presented in video clips format, supplement with reflective questions in the video clips and follow up discussions in the class. Students were required to watch the video clips at Blackboard before lecture to have a preview and review of key issues and response to the questions raised at the end of the video clip. Follow up with in-depth exploration and open discussion in the lecture of related topic.

Its application aimed at (1) bringing in the first-person experience and perspective to the class discussion and inspire our students' learning and understanding of the nature, causes, and consequences of interpersonal violence in different aspects of life, and (2) enhancing students' capacity and ability in identifying and analyzing causes and consequences of interpersonal violence.

The project completed satisfactorily. We have conducted three interview with survivor of domestic violence, child abuse and a war correspondent to share their first-hand experience and perception on related type of IPV. The total length of 2 hours 37mins video clips produced which covered themes on domestic violence, child abuse, sexual violence and interpersonal violence in conflict zone.

There were difficulties on seeking interviewees who have first-hand experience and agree to have their life stories being record in a video, the interview days were postponed in order to accommodate interviewees' schedule for interview.

The focus of interview "Wartime Sexual Violence" has extended to "Sexual Violence and Interpersonal Violence in Conflict Zone" since interviewee we approached in this part is a rich experienced war correspondent who has met people from different walk of community from different Conflict Zone all over the world.

Moreover, the production of the video clips took times. In order to apply the videos on 1st term of 2018-2019 as soon as possible, no Chinese subtitle was added in the first round of videos application in the course of "Interpersonal Violence" (UGEC2680/SOWK2200). All subtitle would be added on or before the March.

3. Evaluation Plan

A quantitative online survey was conducted to evaluate effectiveness of the project. There were total 11 respondents.

To evaluate the first objective, 100% of them agree or strongly agree that the three videos "could bring more visual, concrete and impressive understanding on interpersonal violence to you" and "could enhance your ability on identifying common myths, misconception, and misunderstanding against interpersonal violence". Besides, some student responded that the interviews were impressive for them as they seldom have a chance to hear the first-hand personal experience. Thus, the first objective was achieved.

To evaluate the second objective, 91 % of them agree or strongly agree that the three videos "could enhance your ability on analyzing the causes and consequences of interpersonal violence". Thus, the second objective was achieved.

4. Dissemination, diffusion and impact

The video clips were uploaded to the course blackboard. They promoted interactive learning by increasing students' involvement in various aspects, such as a preview of the documentary video clips, online feedback and in-class discussion. According to the evaluation survey, 100% of the respondents agree or strongly agree that the videos could enhance their learning interest and involvement.

Lessons learnt from the project

The in-depth sharing from the interviewees brought the impressive reflection for students which made the project success.

In fact, the video clips served as an introductory and also a real life example for the class in study related interpersonal violence. Students dialogue with interviewees on both their related subjective experience and perception during they are watching the video clips. The content of video clips facilitated reflective discussion and in-depth sharing among students and lecturer in the class.

However, due to the difficulty of seeking interviewees and the long process of videos production, the working schedule was postponed and the video publications were rush. It is difficult to produce three interview video clips and apply them in the course of following semester. Therefore, the project needs more time such as extra 1-2 months for the video preparation.

This project aims at producing three micro-module teaching videos used as a part of flipped classroom teaching in the course Interpersonal Violence (UGEC2680/SOWK2200). In order to facilitate a more

reflective learning environment and promote a closer understanding of people who have suffered from or got involved in interpersonal violence in local context, it would be beneficial if we can bring in the first-hand and real-life experience in the course of learning. In the past, we have invited victims/ survivors or persons involved to come to the class and talk with our students. However, it is always challenging to arrange sharing sessions in the course due to the time bounded by the course lecture schedule and the pressure for the speakers to face the class. Therefore, the proposed micro-modules can help to bring the voice of the unheard to the class while addressing the aforementioned challenges.

The three micro-modules have been interviewed the victims/ survivors of intimate partner violence and child abuse and a war-correspondent covered the three chosen types of interpersonal violence including "Surviving from the Intimate Partner Violence", "Child Abuse", "Sexual Violence and Interpersonal Violence in Conflict Zone". The micro-modules presented in video clips format, supplement with reflective questions in the video clips and follow up questions for the class discussions. Students are required to watch the video clips at Blackboard before lecture to have a preview and review of key issues and response to the questions raised at the end of the video clip. Its application aims at (1) bringing in the first person experience and perspective to the class discussion and inspire students' learning and understanding of the nature, causes, and consequences of interpersonal violence in different aspects of life, and (2) enhancing their capacity and ability in identifying and analyzing causes and consequences of related interpersonal violence.
