Podcast Name: **Podcast Series for SLW9602 (Principles of Land Law)**

Program Type: Audio

Language: English

Description: These podcasts will be a series of short talks giving listeners an understanding of the principal features of Kong Kong's system of land law. Although they are principally intended for an audience with some legal training it is hoped that they will be accessible to a general audience too.

Land Law is essentially the study of the several forms of ownership rights (and other non-proprietary interests) in land. The podcasts will explain the legal understanding of "land" and the sorts of interest in land that can be acquired and the way that these interests can be acquired. They explain who "wins" when there are conflicting claims in respect of the same piece of land. The series will look at how interests in land are created and how they can be given away, sold, brought to an end and so on.

- New audio files are added over time...

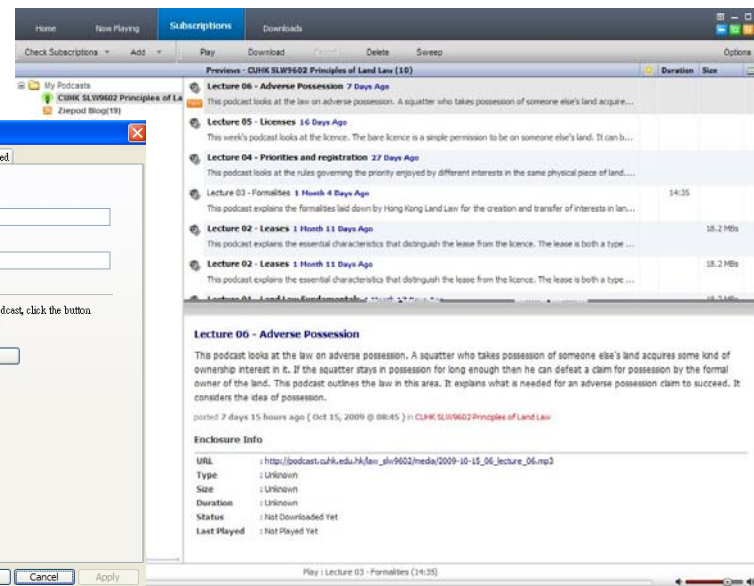
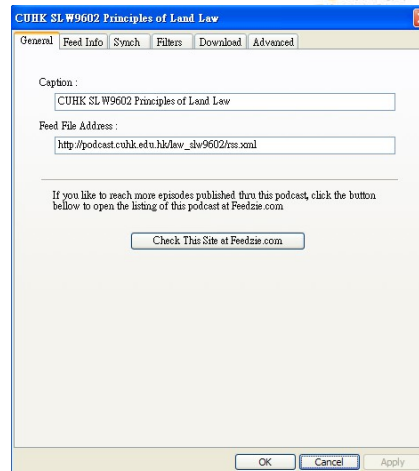
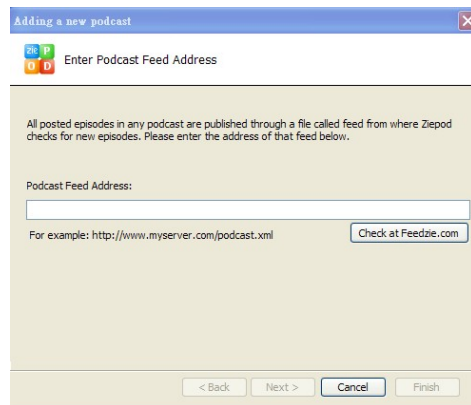

Receiving podcasts

- Use podcast aggregator (a.k.a podcast receiver / software)
 - E.g. iTunes, Juice, ZiePod
- Subscribe to feed URL
- Aggregator automatically downloads latest audio files
- Synchronise portable media player with aggregator
- Listen to audio files...

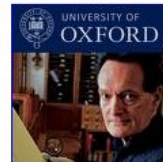

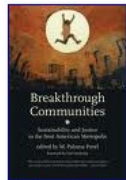

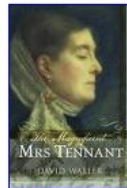

Benefits of podcasting (students)

- Uses a delivery device they are very familiar with and accustomed to carrying and using regularly
- Allows them to access the materials anytime, in any place and any number of times
- Use of audio/video medium adds variety to the learning experience

Benefits of podcasting (teachers)

- Appeals to the digital natives
- Easy and low cost to create and distribute
- Caters for different learning styles
- Flexible, lots of possible applications

Creating your podcast

1. Select your content
2. Determine your instructional goal
3. Design your content
4. Produce your podcast
5. Incorporate the podcast into your course

Step 1: Select appropriate content

- Avoid overly complex and dense content material that includes lots of facts and figures
- Recordings of classroom lectures may not be the best use of podcasting
- Narrow the focus of a podcast

Step 2: Determine your instructional goal

Instructional Goal	Podcast focus
Prepare or motivate learners for learning new content	<p>Arouse interest and curiosity about a new topic to increase learner motivation</p> <p>Inform students of the learning outcomes or benefits of learning new content</p> <p>Influence feelings and attitudes about a topic prior to a lecture or reading assignment</p>
Recall and integrate previously learned material with new content	<p>Explain the connection between what students have previously learned with new content to be presented in a lecture or reading assignment</p>
Provide high-level overviews	<p>Prior to presenting a new topic, provide a general overview as an advanced organizer</p> <p>Before teaching a complex skill or procedure provide a mental framework from which to approach it</p>
Provide content to encourage analysis	<p>Provide a stimulus for students to react to or reflect upon for deeper analysis</p>
Provide some variety in the learning environment	<p>Bring in other people's viewpoints</p>
Student projects and assignments	<p>Students create their own podcasts</p>

Step 3: Design your content

- Frame your content into a problem or challenge and explain how that problem or challenge can be addressed
- Obtain voices of other experts you've interviewed about specific topics of interest to students in the course.
- Use a case story that illustrates a key topic or learning goal
- Share a personal storyCapture dialogues with opposing viewpoints
- Keep the length of a podcast short

Step 4: Produce your podcast

- Don't lecture
- Talk as if you were speaking with a student
- Express your passion, enthusiasm and excitement for the content material in your voice and tone
- Be yourself, flaws and all. Listeners will tolerate
- Edit out extraneous material later if you want

Recording and editing your podcast

- To record/edit a podcast, you'll need:
 - A computer
 - A microphone
 - Software to record and edit the podcast.
 - For audio podcasts, Audacity is a good choice.
 - For video podcasts, Windows Movie Maker (Windows) and iMovie (Mac) are good choices.
 - Storage for the audio file you create - Podcast@CUHK

Step 5: Incorporate the podcast into your course

- Tightly integrate a podcast into your course content and learning activities
- If you make it optional, most students will not listen to it
- Make sure it is perceived as valuable by your students

Issues to be aware of...

- Students don't have portable mp3 players (about 60% do...)
- Only a portion of podcasts are actually downloaded onto portable media players
- Will students still come to lectures?
- Public access to audio files is necessary (no access control)
- Cannot search or scan podcast content
- Any others....?
