Announcing:

Dow-Fulbright Research Fellowship *in the Fields of Environment, Energy, Health, Sustainability, Education and Science and Technology* **2010-2011**



The Dow Chemical Company has partnered with the Fulbright Program to offer a prestigious fellowship to a Ph.D. candidate in a Hong Kong university to conduct research in an American university in 2010-2011 on his/her doctoral dissertation relating to any of the above broad fields of study. Candidates may be from Hong Kong, Mainland China or anywhere in the world. They should have completed at least two years of post-graduate study in HK before departing for the U.S.

The duration of the award must be at least six months, but not longer than ten months, based on the project proposal. The grant award will be US\$ 1,600 per month, which may be augmented by a studentship from the HK university. Fulbright will arrange affiliation with an American university, including waived tuition fees. Priority will be given to affiliations with a university in the state of Michigan. The Dow-Fulbright Fellow will be expected to return to HK after the award and defend the dissertation thesis for the doctoral degree at the HK university.



The deadline for applications for this special Dow-Fulbright award is **Monday, November 9, 2009** at the Hong Kong America Center.
