# About 21<sup>st</sup> Century Cup National English Speaking Competition organized by China Daily 21<sup>st</sup> Century English Newspapers

**China Daily** is the first and only national English-language newspaper group in modern China since 1949. **China Daily** is well aware of the severe competition and increasing importance of international exchange in the world market. It believes that a pool of high quality foreign language talents is the key for China to enter into the international arena and in turn for the world to understand modern China. In 1993, **China Daily**, in response to the demand of a broad base of English learners, founded the **21**<sup>st</sup> **Century English Newspapers** prior to China's bid to organize the 2008 Olympic Games. This weekly publication focuses on reporting international affairs and providing English learning guidance. It creates an ideal learning platform to nurture English-speaking talents in China.

The 21<sup>st</sup> Century Cup National English Speaking Competition (the competition) was founded by China Daily in 1996. With an aim to encourage sustainable development of the English language teaching profession and modernization of Chinese people, the competition has strong support from the State Council Information Office and Ministry of Education of the People's Republic of China. Since then, the competition has been designated as the official tournament to select Chinese candidates to participate in the annual International Public Speaking Competition organized by the English Speaking Union.

The competition is an influential international event for academic exchange. The judging panel consists of language experts of the world's leading English teaching institutions, and professors of renowned universities in the UK and the US. Since 2002, the 21st Century International English Language Teaching Forum has been organized concurrently with the competition. Representatives from leading international institutions such as the English Speaking Union (ESU), Educational Testing Network Service (ETS), the University of Cambridge Local Examinations Syndicate (UCLES) and Teachers of English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL) participate in symposia to promote the English teaching profession in China.

So far, the 21<sup>st</sup> Century Cup National English Speaking Competition has been successfully held in Beijing, Shanghai, Guangzhou, Chengdu, Nanjing, Wuhan, Shenzhen and Macau, over a period of 11 years. With its tight-knit organizational structure and strict governing rules, the competition is the most reputable English speaking contest in China. The outstanding performance of the contestants has gained great attention inside and outside the country, thereby fulfilling our goals in meeting the highest standard of English speaking and education.

Over the years, the  $21^{st}$  Century Cup has successfully nurtured a group of English speaking elites. For instance, Ms Liu Xin (劉欣), champion of first  $21^{st}$  Century Cup, was the overall champion in the International Public Speaking Competition held in 1996 in London. She received high commendations from the Ministry of Education and related officers-in-chief and she is currently the host of CCTV Overseas Centre English Channel. The champions of 1999 and 2002, Mr. Cai Li (蔡力) and Mr. Zheng Yong (張勇), were

named "The Best Non-native Speaker" in the international tournament in London. Last year, Mr. Xia Peng (夏鵬), the overall champion of the  $21^{st}$  Century Cup 2005, won the overall championship and the "Most Popular" award in London. He was later invited by Prince Philip Duke of Edinburgh for a special treat in July. Their brilliant performances have demonstrated the strong English speaking skills of Chinese students.

## **About the Tournament**

Stage 1: essay competition preliminaries

- Eligibility: university students nominated by their own universities
- Schedule: June September
- Format: each contestant submits a 500-word essay and an audio tape of their speeches. Oral test via telephone by judging panel.

Stage 2: regional contest

- Eligibility: 30 winners in each region from stage 1. A total of 120 candidates will be selected in 4 regions.
- Schedule: October November
- Venue:

Northern region: Beijing, Tianjin, Hebei, Shanxi, Heilongjiang, Liaoning, Jilin, Inner Mongolia

Eastern region: Shanghai, Zhejiang, Anhui, Jiangsu, Shandong, Henan

Southern region: Hunan, Hubei, Jiangxi, Fujian, Guangdong, Guangxi, Hainan

Western region: Xinjiang, Tibet, Qinghai, Ningxia, Shanxi, Gansu, Yunnan, Guizhou, Sichuan, Chongqing

• Format: prepared speech, impromptu speech, Q&A

Stage 3: national tournament

- Eligibility: 10 mainland winners from last year's competition, 40 winners from regional contests in stage 2, and 10 candidates from Hong Kong, Macau, Taiwan and other Asian countries
- Schedule: March or April
- Venue: a selected major city in China
- Format: semi-final and final in 3 days, including prepared speech, impromptu speech and Q&A

Major Prizes

- Grand champion, first and second runners-up, first-prize (7 winners): study trips to UK, Australia or Singapore
- Second prize (15 winners): cash prize of 1,500 yuan
- Third prize (35 winners): cash prize of 1,000 yuan

Special Prizes

• The Most Promising Speaker Award: a scholarship to take part in the annual International Public Speaking Competition in London

- The Lenovo Creativity Award: cash prize of 3,000 yuan
- The Most Humourous Speaker Award: cash prize of 2,000 yuan
- The Most Graceful Speaker Award: cash prize 2,000 yuan
- The Outstanding Foreign Speaker Award: 2,000 yuan

#### Prizes for tutors

Tutors of the grand champion, first runner-up and second runner-up will be invited to attend the annual IATEFL (International Association of Teachers of English as a Foreign Language) Conference to be held in 2007 in UK. Tutors of 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> place winners will be sponsored by Macquarie University for a one-week study tour to Sydney.

All contestants and their tutors receive certificates and book prizes.
