1973 has been an auspicious year for the Journal of Chinese Linguistics: it has become a truly international publication with subscriptions from some 28 countries. We have established an exchange program with Language, the All-Union State Library of Foreign Literature (Moscow), and Revue Bibliographique de Sinologie (Paris). In addition, complimentary subscriptions are sent to the Project on Linguistic Analysis, Center for Applied Linguistics, Chinese Language Teachers' Association, and Yu Yan Yan Jiu Suo (Peking).

The past year has also seen the healthy beginning of scholarly exchange with the People's Republic of China. Several linguists from the United States have visited and held professional discussions with their colleagues in China.

The Journal of Chinese Linguistics is not self-supporting as yet. Therefore, it is extremely important for all our friends to help us increase the number of subscriptions.

We continue to welcome works on all aspects of the Chinese language: historical and descriptive, theoretical and applied, social, psychological, literary, etc.
