

Chinese studies has a long and exceptionally rich history on the Korean peninsula, and in recent years has undergone a period of rapid growth, with more than two hundred universities in South Korea now teaching Chinese language and literature programs. And yet thanks to the fact that the vast majority of research in this country is only ever published in Korean, there has been little opportunity to introduce Korean scholarship to the international academic community. The Korea Society of Chinese Language and Literature (President: Jaewoo Park) already publishes Chinese and Korean language papers in their regular journal and this will now be joined by an annual English-language journal which is specifically aimed at enhancing communication between scholars at home and abroad: the *Korea Journal of Chinese Language and Literature*.

The focus of the *Korea Journal of Chinese Language and Literature* is threefold. It is intended as a forum to introduce the most advanced research conducted in Korea in the fields of Chinese linguistics, language pedagogy, and Chinese literature to an international English-speaking academic audience. At the same time, this journal also accepts articles from scholars based outside Korea, in the hope of enhancing scholarly understanding and collaboration. With this aim in mind, an Advisory Editorial Committee of highly distinguished scholars has been assembled to review the papers submitted. It is hoped that in the future this journal will make a significant contribution towards the globalization of Korean research in the field of Chinese language and literature.

The World Publishing Corporation in Beijing has started two new linguistic series: *Linguistics in China* (语言学文选) and 《语言学译林》 (Linguistics Abroad), edited by SHI Feng 石锋 and ZHANG Hongming 张洪明.

The first issue of *Linguistics in China* has just appeared with a publication year of 2010 and has 339 pages of papers translated from Chinese into English. This issue is divided into 4 parts: Phonology, Language change, Syntax, and Semantics. Phonology and Language change each contains 4 papers; Syntax and Semantics, each contains 5 papers. Of these 18 papers, 8 were selected from *Zhongguo Yuwen*; the other 10 from other sources. The oldest paper included is from 1990, by DAI Qingxia on tense/lax vowels in Tibeto-Burman; the newest paper is from 2010, by Yeshe Vodgsal Atshogs on the formation of mixed languages.

As for 《语言学译林》 (Linguistics Abroad), the first issue will be published in June of 2011 and has 320 pages, which are divided into 2 parts: 14 of papers translated from English into Chinese and 8 of essays introducing, summarizing, or commenting on the works published in the English world.

The ultimate goal of linguistic study is to explore the nature of human language. Universal factors of language hide behind peculiarities of specific tongues, while the same unique features are embodiments of the universals. The Chinese linguists have strived to make their own contributions in the course of that exploration. Through these two series, the editors hope to introduce important linguistic researches overseas to China and aims at disseminating Chinese linguistic researches to the rest of the world. As complements to each other, these two series are stepping stones in the journey toward the goal.
