



## CUHK Summer Institute 2009

### Regulations and Student Consent Form

#### General Regulations

1. Eligibility for the CUHK Summer Institute 2009 cannot be transferred.
2. Students are advised to look after their own belongings and money. They are fully responsible for any loss of personal property.
3. Students should follow the time schedules set and be punctual for all activities.
4. Students should pay attention to safety during activities.
5. To avoid becoming lost, students are advised not to leave public areas by themselves unless they get permission to do so. However, if anyone does go astray, then students are advised to stay calm and contact our staff (Tel: 2696 1827) or the CUHK Security Unit (Tel: 2609 7999) immediately.
6. If students feel sick or physically weak or become injured, they should inform our staff immediately.
7. In the case of any unforeseen circumstances such as bad weather, our staff reserves the right to cancel or alter the activities. CUHK shall not be liable for any loss resulting from such cancellation or change.
8. If students disobey any of the established regulations, the staff is authorized to terminate the activity in which they are participating. In serious cases, students may be expelled from the programme immediately with no refund of the fee paid.
9. If students withdraw after the CUHK Summer Institute prior to its completion, they will be responsible for all costs arising out of their voluntary withdrawal, including withdrawal caused by illness or disciplinary action.
10. Our staff will take videos and photos during the activities, and these may be published on the Summer Institute website and in relevant publications. The Office of Summer Programmes reserves the right to their use.
11. International students should carry adequate medical insurance for their stay in Hong Kong.

#### Hostel Regulations

1. Hostel rooms are randomly assigned by our staff. Students are not allowed to change rooms without prior approval.
2. Students should not leave their belongings in public areas (e.g., the kitchen, fire exits and hallways). Such items may be disposed of if found.
3. Students are required to keep the hostel clean and tidy.
4. Students are required to dress properly in the public areas of the hostel.
5. Students should use the hostel facilities with care. If they damage these facilities, then they will be responsible for any costs incurred.
6. Students should close windows and doors and switch off lights, fans and air-conditioners when they leave their rooms.
7. The following types of behaviour are strictly prohibited in the hostel:
  - (a) violating Hong Kong law;
  - (b) possessing illegal or dangerous items;
  - (c) smoking cigarettes, consuming alcoholic drinks or gambling;
  - (d) possessing pornographic materials;
  - (e) being in a hostel room with a member of the opposite sex outside of hostel visiting hours (8:00 am to 12:00 midnight);
  - (f) making disturbing noises between 11:00 pm and 8:00 am; and
  - (g) having hostel keys duplicated or lending them to others.
8. When moving out on 1 August 2009, students are required to clear out all of their belongings and return their room keys to the hostel staff in the lobby.
