Student Exchange Programme with University of Kent and University of Warwick, UK

Department of Sociology is now offering student exchange programme in the academic year of 2020/21 with

- (1) School of Social Policy, Sociology and Social Research, University of Kent, UK
- (2) Department of Sociology, University of Warwick, UK

The captioned exchange programme is established to provide our undergraduate students the opportunity to study at one of the most prestigious departments of Sociology in UK, and allow students to gain a firsthand understanding and experience of foreign culture, society and college life.

Quota

Under the programme, our department will select up to one undergraduate student to the University of Kent for exchange of one academic year (more preferable), or up to two students for exchange for the 1st term. Our department will also select up to one undergraduate student to the University of Warwick for exchange of one academic year (more preferable), or up to two students for exchange for the 1st term.

The University of Kent and the University of Warwick will also send undergraduate students to study at the Chinese University of Hong Kong. Credit transfers can be done in the same manner as the other university exchange programmes.

Eligibility

Full-time undergraduate students majoring in Sociology, except those who will graduate in Term 1 of 2019/20, are eligible for the exchange programme. University of Warwick is open to year 2 or above students.

Students are expected to have a cumulative GPA of 3.00 or above. Year 1 students will also be assessed by their HKDSE results or other examination results.

English Language Requirements

Applicants should be proficient in English with a valid IELTS or TOEFL score report. The minimum required scores are listed below.

 - 3. A copy of the valid IELTS/ TOEFL score report

- 4. (Applicable to year 1 students only) Academic results report(s) of secondary/ post-secondary education (e.g. HKDSE / IB certificate, associate degree transcript)
- Shortlisted candidates may be invited for an interview in <u>early/mid January</u> 2020 if needed.
- The IELTS /TOEFL score report should be submitted no later than <u>12:00 noon</u> of 17 January 2020 (Friday).
- Result of selection will be announced on <u>31 January 2020 (Friday)</u>.
