I. Educational Aims and Characteristics

The basic educational aims of the Divinity School of Chung Chi College are threefold: (1) to help students grow as mature persons, (2) to equip them in every way so that they can minister in the Spirit of Christ, (3) to promote theological research, enable inter-disciplinary dialogue and facilitate intellectual and cultural development in Hong Kong, Mainland China and overseas Chinese communities.

Divinity School of Chung Chi College is at present the only theological education institution within a Chinese public university. Apart from training pastoral workers, it also aims at raising the level of theologizing of the laity. Intellectual development, spiritual formation, community life, individual critical thinking and self-discipline are the quadrilateral of the School. The School does not belong to any single denomination; it is supported by denominations of several traditions, viz., Congregational, Presbyterian, Reformed, Lutheran, Anglican, Pentecostal, and Methodist. As a result, the approach to theological studies is open and not biased towards a particular doctrinal confession. Acceptance of each other's tradition is stressed.

Divinity School of Chung Chi College takes an ecumenical approach to theological studies. The Bible is accepted to be the main authority for faith and life. Through the historical, literary, sociological, critical approaches to the studies of Scriptures, students and faculty endeavor to be faithful to the living Word of God and to interpret the Bible in the context of the contemporary Church and the world. Students are not required to accept any specific doctrinal position but all are encouraged to develop and defend their chosen theological positions by means of the highest standards of scholarship. Mutual respect in spite of differences in doctrine is heavily stressed as the prerequisite for community life and good scholarship.

We aim to provide a holistic education which includes all aspects of spiritual, intellectual and social development. The curricula of the various degree programmes in the Divinity School of Chung Chi College are oriented toward Missio Dei. Practical training for ministry is stressed along with intellectual and spiritual development. Recently, the project of Integration of Clinical Pastoral Education and Theological Education is implemented as one of our training models.

Full time single students are expected to be in residence in the Theology Building. Family quarters are also provided for students with family. Opportunities for interaction with students of other Departments are plentiful in CUHK. Students are encouraged to exercise self-discipline, integrity and respect. Students can choose to take for credit or audit all the courses offered by CUHK as long as he/she meets the requirements of that particular department. Students can also enjoy the facilities provided by CUHK, so that they may engage knowledge in all ways and interact with faculty and students from different departments. The extensive academic environment and broad campus will enable them to widen their horizon and become leaders of the times.

II. Brief History

In Chung Chi College, the traditions of theological education from the mainland churches and thirteen Christian colleges of Mainland China have been preserved and developed. The historical roots of the Divinity School of Chung Chi College go back as far as 1864 when the Training School of Canton Presbyterian Mission was established at Fati, Guangdong. In 1914, this School joined with the Anglican Church and the Methodist Church to form Canton Union Theological College. During the War, this College had, at various times, affiliated with the University of Central China and with Lingnam University. After the War, the Anglican Church, Wei Li Kung Hui, and Christian Mission to Buddhists joined together to establish Hong Kong Union Theological College. The Church of Christ in China and the Chinese Methodist Church supported Trinity Theological College in Singapore.

Chung Chi College had been having religious education and theological training as part of the academic programme since 1957. Before joining The Chinese University of Hong Kong in 1963, the theological training was separately provided by Chung Chi Theological Seminary, with the Hong Kong Theological Institute of the Church of Christ in China as the nucleus. Dr. Chi Tung YUNG, the President of Chung Chi College, was the first President of the Chung Chi Theological Seminary. Chung Chi Theological Seminary continued the affiliation with Chung Chi College.

The Seminary was established as a joint effort by the Hong Kong Council of the Church of Christ in China, the Anglican Church, the Chinese Methodist Church, Wei Li Kung Hui, Swatow Baptist Church and the Tsung Tsin Mission. The Board of the Seminary which was formed by representatives from the supporting churches, planned the construction of the Theology Building on the campus of the Chung Chi College. In 1966, Tsung Tsin Lok Yuk Seminary joined the Chung Chi Theological Seminary. Lok Yuk Seminary had a history which went back to 1864 when it was first established in Lilong of Po On District. After changing locations for several times, it was finally re-established in Sai Kung, Hong Kong in 1955.

In 1968, the Seminary as such ceased to exist and its function was transferred to the Theology Division (the former name of the Divinity School of Chung Chi College) in the reorganized Department of Philosophy and Religion of the Chinese University of Hong Kong, later known as the Department of Religion in 1978 and restructured to be the Department of Cultural and Religious Studies in 2004. The Theology Building was completed and began to function in 1969 and was renovated in 2000. The Divinity School of Chung Chi College, under the Theological Council, is mainly financed independently by Church gifts and funds from the Trustees of Chung Chi College; but academically, it is a recognized part of the University to offer degree programmes in Theology and Christian Studies. In memory of Rev. Pommerenke who donated a piece of land at Siu Tao Fung Shan, the Pommerenke Lectureship of Christianity and Chinese Culture has been set up since 1998 by the Trustees of the College.

To strengthen its current unique identity as the only theological education institution within a Chinese public university and in order to enhance the collaboration with other seminaries in other parts of the world, Theology Division is renamed as Divinity School of Chung Chi College with effect from August 1, 2004.

Divinity School of Chung Chi College is also a full member of the Association for Theological Education in South East Asia (ATESEA) and the Hong Kong Theological Education Association and offers programmes of the South East Asia Graduate School of Theology (established by ATESEA).

A little more than half of our alumni were ordained ministers and serve in various parishes in Hong Kong and abroad. The rest serve in tertiary institutions, seminaries, Christian organizations, education and social service agencies, industrial, commercial and other professional sectors.

III. Supporting Churches

The Churches represented in the Theological Council are: the Anglican Church, the Church of Christ in China (Hong Kong Council), the Tsung Tsin Mission, the Methodist Church, Hong Kong and Pentecostal Holiness Church.

IV. Programmes of Study

A. Degree Programmes of The Chinese University of Hong Kong

1. Bachelor of Arts (Theology Major)

An applicant must have passed The Chinese University of Hong Kong matriculation or have obtained exemption from it. It will take at least 3 years to complete this full-time programme. The programme of study includes basic theological studies, general education, languages; he/she can also opt for minor subjects.

Language Requirement

Reading knowledge of at least one language other than English and Chinese is required. The required language may vary according to the field of specialization of the student and is to be advised by individual supervisors.

Candidacy (Comprehensive) Examination

Candidacy examination will take place upon completion of course work and language requirement. The passing of this examination is mandatory for continuation in the Ph.D. (Post-candidacy) Programme. Three written examinations are required to be taken by the end of the second year and would be examined in at least 2 areas of study or as prescribed by individual supervisors.

Post-candidacy

Ph.D. (Post-candidacy) students continue to enroll in "Thesis Research Courses" each term throughout their thesis preparation. Though lecture course is not a compulsory component for Ph.D. (post-candidacy) students, they may be requested to take additional courses if the Division finds it necessary.

B. Degree Programmes of South East Asia Graduate School of Theology (SEAGST)

Qualified persons can study as associate students in The Chinese University of Hong Kong with the Divinity School of Chung Chi College for external degrees offered by the regional programmes of the South East Asia Graduate School of Theology (established by the Association for Theological Education in South East Asia). Degrees conferred are as follows:

1. Bachelor of Divinity (B.D.)

Applicants should have a university entrance standard. It takes normally 5 years to complete this full-time programme, but 3 years for graduates with a college degree (including B.Th.) and 4 years for form six graduates with a professional training not less than two years. Full time church or Christian organization workers, and Christian with a doctorate in other subjects, could apply for part-time study. Length of study varies according to individual merit. The programme of study includes basic theological studies plus other subjects as needed or desired to prepare for a vocation of ministry.

(a) Entrance Requirements:

Candidates should have successfully completed matriculation in Hong Kong, or the equivalent, plus one year of working experience. For candidatesover 25 years old, the minimum requirement is the Certificate of Education or equivalent, plus five years of working experience. All candidates accepted must have acquired an academic standing at least equivalent to the minimum entrance requirement for University students. Candidates are normally required to have church backing, and must provide the names of three referees who are willing to write confidential recommendation; and among them, one of whom must be a church minister.

(b) Procedure of Studying:

Students should study the basic courses in area (1) to (3), then study the more advanced area (4) to (6). Except upon exemption, Intro. to NT/OT, Biblical Language, Systematic Theology I & II and Local Church Studies must be taken in 1st year.

(c) Requirements for Graduation:

- (1) Completed the required courses.
- (2) Comprehensive Examination
 - (i) Date: The third Tuesday and Wednesday of May. (Thursday is Term End Commencement)
 - (ii) Examination after 2 years of study for the 3-year programme. Examination after 3 years of study for the 5-year programme. Examination after 2 or 3 years of study for the 4-year programme.

(iii) Examination Courses:

Theology - at least 3 courses completed
History of Christianity - at least 2 courses completed

(v) Supplementary Examination:

Supplementary examination will be held not later than the end of August of the same year. A candidate who fails in the Supplementary Examination should repeat one year, and sit again for the Examination in next May. The candidate who fails in the retrial should withdraw himself/herself from the programme.

- (3) (i) Area: Missiology or other related topics. Topics approved by the instructor should be submitted during the first two months of the first semester in the final academic year, or according to the requirement of the supervisor of thesis writing.
 - (ii) Length: within 25,000 words.
 - (iii) Date of Submission: May 31

(d) Programme of Study:

The programme of study is 5 years full-time. In general, the requirements for the B.D. degree are parallel to the core curriculum for the Bachelor of Arts (Theology major) degree. Candidates for the B.D. degree must fulfill the same requirements in English and Chinese, Physical Education, General Education and Intensive Programme in Putonghua, Cantonese and English as matriculated students in the University. They are encouraged to choose a wide range of elective subjects especially in Social Science and Philosophy. They are also required to study at least one year of a Biblical Language. The required minimum number of units for the five-year programme is 159. (1 unit = 1 hour for 1 semester of 13/14 weeks.)

The structure of this programme is basically the same as that of "3- year Programme (for degree holders or equivalent)". However, with the approval of our School, students who are B.Th. degree holders may change the study plan as follows:

 Unit exemption: Only limited to Biblical Language (maximum 6 units) and Field Education (maximum 8 units) courses 2. Reallocation of units in study areas: According individual needs, students may apply to respective lecturers to re-allocate the unit requirements of Area (1) to (4) to other study areas. (e.g. to change the requirement of 12 units to 9 units in Theology Area and relocate this 3 units to be Electives) However, the student must fulfill the minimum required units in each area after reallocation.

Students should apply for changes in study plan to Programme Director within the second term of the first year of study.

2. Master of Theology (M.Theol.)

Applicants should have a M.Div. or B.D. degree upon application, and they must also pass the entrance examination. It takes 2 years for full-time students and 4 years for part-time students to complete the programme. The programme of study includes advanced research and thesis focused on one special area of theological studies. [Please refer to the Student Handbook of The South East Asia Graduate School of Theology (Hong Kong Area) Master of Theology Degree Program]

3. Doctor of Theology (D.Theol.)

Applicants should have obtained a M.Theol. degree or equivalent [e.g. S.T.M. or M.A. after B.Th. or B.A. (major in theology)] with outstanding ability in research. Applicants are required to submit a research proposal for application. It takes 3 years for full-time students and 6 years for part-time students to complete the program. Qualified candidates may be given opportunities to study in theological institutes under the South East Asia Graduate School of Theology. [Please refer to the Student Handbook of The South East Asia Graduate School of Theology (Hong Kong Area) Doctor of Theology Degree Program]

C. Specially Designed Programmes

Students engaged in advanced research or doctoral studies elsewhere may be allowed to use the theological resources in the University for limited period of time as associate students. Full-time church workers are also welcome to take courses and allowed to use the theological resources in the University. B.D. and M.Div. graduates (within 2 years after graduation) could get reimbursement of tuition fees (one course per semester) if their attendance is not less than 80%.

VII. Assistantship and Scholarship

Most students in the Divinity School of Chung Chi College are supported financially by their own denominations. As for those students who are enrolled in The Chinese University of Hong Kong Degree Programmes, they can seek government loans. M.Phil. and Ph.D. students can apply for research or teaching assistant positions. There are also prizes, awards, and grants which are donated to the School by the Church of Christ in China Hong Kong Council, Tsung Tsin Mission Kau Yan Church, the Chinese United Church in Washington, D. C., St. Thomas Church of Sheng Kung Hui, Calvary Church, alumni, and Christians who support the theological education ministry of the School. Donations benefit students with financial difficulties and also encourage them to excel in the areas of pastoral care, ministry, service, ecumenical cooperation, community life, extracurricular activities, thesis writing, scholarship and spirituality. Since our school was founded, we have been zealously reaching out from our own locale: promoting the knowledge of both Chinese and Western academia, encouraging our students, pastors and others to embrace pluralistic traditions, developing a globalistic horizon, devoting ourselves to interact with both the academic institutions of Mainland China and other countries, and establishing platforms for overseas exchange. In the earlier days, our school has built close ties (or has partnership programmes) with some theological institutions in South East Asia such as Trinity Theological College, Singapore and also Tainan Theological College and Seminary. Moreover, as a member of ATESEA, we pro-actively cooperate with 104 theological institutions from 16 countries/regions all over Asia. Since 1998, our school has begun to share our teaching resources with Myanmar's seminaries, through cooperation with Association for Theological Education in Myanmar (ATEM) and Methodist Theological College (in cooperation with The Methodist Church, Great Britain) to develop and train the teachers there. In the last decade, our school has also taken a further step to strengthen our cooperation with other theological institutions in the west. For example, from 1999 to 2006, we began to cooperate with the Westminster College, Oxford to offer distance learning programme that lead to the award of BTh (Oxon). After the Westminster College joined the Oxford Brookes University, in addition to the Oxon programme, the collaboration offered also a similar programme that lead to BA (Hon) in Theology. We successfully conducted immersion courses for Andover Newton Theological School in 2004 and Graduate Theological Union, Berkeley in 2007. We are now making plans to conduct the same one for Perkins School of Theology at Southern Methodist University in January 2009. From 2010, our school is going to implement exchange programmes with Yale Divinity School. IX. Pastoral Programme

A. Brief History

Two characteristics are distinctive to the Divinity School of Chung Chi College: first, she is a pan-denominational collaboration aiming at training various kinds of minister; second, as a constitutive part of a university, she is an academic unit. These two characteristics naturally give the basic form of her mission: an endeavor to integrate theological theories with ministerial practice. In view of all these, the 1981 Theological Education Consultation Meeting decided to establish a "Pastoral Center", emphasizing that a close cooperation between the Divinity School of Chung Chi College and churches. In 1983, the Theological Council endorsed this idea. Under the auspices of The Hong Kong Council of the Church of Christ in China, the "Pastoral Programme" was experimentally set up in 1984. Our thanks go to God for the achievements that the Pastoral Programme has made during the years. The "Pastoral Programme" is now an essential and integral part of the School. In July 1998, the Theological Council resolved to create a post with the title "Practical Education Co-ordinator". In order to enhance students' ability to integrate theory and practice, it was decided that the post be filled by a candidate who, on the one hand, had obtained a doctorate in theology. and on the other hand, has had experience in teaching. The setting up of this post has been very smooth with the support of CWM/Nethersole Fund and Chan King Yee Family Fund. The further development of the "Pastoral Programme", however, could only be possible with the full support of the Christian community. Besides, thanks also go to the CWM/Nethersole Fund, in particular for their support to the project entitled "Mission Enhancement Project", which began in 2000. A project executive who has attained a higher degree in theology as well as received training in Journalism and Communication has been employed to plan and execute the concerned programmes and activities. This project will set up a Christian "think-tank" dedicated to enhance the local churches to carry out their mission more effectively in a society with increasingly complicated issues and new challenges.

Since 2006, because of the rapid expansion of the Pastoral Program, we added an additional Associate Director of Pastoral Program to help with the coordination and restructuring of our programs and also strengthening the relationships with local churches. We also started a new "Young Pastor Support Network" program in 2007, to provide young pastors with continuing spiritual formation, direction and training.

B. Programmes and Activities

From the very beginning, the Pastoral Programme has been adopting a multi-dimensional approach to realize her mission. The programmes and activities she organizes can be categorized into several strategies:

1. Nurturing the To-Be-Ministers

- a. Upgrading the qualities of Field Education.
- Cooperating with non-local Christian Communities in the provision of fieldwork Placements.
- c. Closely cooperating with bodies providing Clinical Pastoral Education.
- d. Teaching pastoral subjects.
- e. Conducting researches in the area of pastoral studies.

2. Meeting the Educational Needs of Local Ministers

- a. Providing tailor-made refresher courses and talks to local ministers.
- b. Admitting qualified local ministers into our part-time degree programmes.
- c. Organizing contextually relevant seminars for church workers.
- d. Creating and exploring other educational opportunities for church ministers.

3. Organizing Retreat Camp for Local Ministers

Organizing retreat camps for local ministers every year to help them to reflect on their own ministries and life, and encouraging them to share their experiences among themselves.

4. Implementing "Mission Enhancement Project"

This project serves Hong Kong churches by assuming the roles of a "think tank" by developing a network of experts, scholars, and experienced pastors, pooling together the most current information about the situation of Hong Kong, and integrating social analysis and theological reflection, so that church ministers and lay leaders can have a deeper grasp of these issues to do theological reflection. It thereby enhances the competence of the churches in responding to complicated social issues, so that the Hong Kong churches may carry out their mission more relevantly and effectively. The project publishes a monthly bulletin which analyzes social issues which churches are concerned with and provides various perspectives for reference. Moreover, it conducts researches on the situation of the church and society. It also offers courses and organizes seminars.

5. "Young Pastor Support Network" program

This program provides young pastors with continuing spiritual direction and concrete support, instructions and training, including the following goals:

Building a pastoral support and resource sharing network

- b. Providing continuing education opportunities for pastors
- c. Providing continuing spiritual formation and direction
- d. Establishing an Experienced Pastors Consultant Group to help young pastors

The Program includes the following services:

- Case Supervision and Study Groups to help young pastors in personal and pastoral issues
- b. Individual counseling for pastors and group spiritual direction
- Spiritual renewal retreats for pastors to renew physical, psychological and spiritual strength
- d. Consultation for young pastors by experienced pastors
- e. Provide for pastors personality tests such as PFP and 16PF to help them assess their personality, gifts and ministries

6. Annual Pastoral Conference

In accordance with the development of pastoral ministry in Hong Kong, pastoral conferences are organized to explore of issues arising from pastoral ministry. Since 2007, this conference has been held annually, and conference papers have been published.

7. Promoting Theological Studies

- a. Co-ordinating the extramural theology programmes jointly run by the Divinity School of Chung Chi College and the School of Continuing and Professional Studies of The Chinese University of Hong Kong.
- Organizing the Theology Training (Ministry) for Laity with Churches (The Hong Kong Council of the Church of Christ in China and the Methodist Church). Providing pastoral workers with suitable and professional training in theology.
- C. Organising the Chuen King Memorial Lectures. This lectureship funding has been donated by Mr. Bing-lai Wong, a reputable Christian businessman of Hong Kong to commemorate his father, Mr. Chuen-king Wong. The following lists the lecturers invited: In 1996, Prof. A.J. Malherbe of Yale University and Prof. C.K. Barrett of Durham University; in 1997 Prof. Kosuke Koyama, a famous Japanese theologian of New York Union Theological Seminary. In 1998 17 local scholars were invited to lecture on the theme "Reading, Studying and Interpreting the Bible", the focus was on the diversity in methods of Bible interpretation. In February 2000, Prof. Gerd Theissen of Heidelberg University.; in January 2001, Prof. Jack M. Sasson of the Vanderbilt University: in October 2002. Prof. Morna Hooker of the Cambridge University; in March 2003, Prof. James Dunn of the Durham University; in March and September 2004, Prof. Choon Leong Seow of Princeton Theological Seminary and another world renowned Old Testament scholar, Prof. James Barr, respectively: in January 2005, Prof. Elisabeth Schüssler Fiorenza from Harvard Divinity School; in February 2006, Prof. Howard Marshall of University of Aberdeen; in March and

September 2007, Emeritus Professor David. J. A. Clines of of University of Sheffield and Prof. David Ussishkin, Professor Emeritus of Archaeology; in February 2009, Prof. Michael Stone of Professor Emeritus of the Hebrew University of Jerusalem and in March 2010, Prof. James. H. Charlesworth, George L. Collard Professor of New Testament Language at Princeton Seminary.

- d. Organizing Pommerenke Lectures which investigate, in particular, the relationship between Christianity and Chinese cultures. This lectureship is set up in memory of the Rev. Pommerenke who donated a site at Tao Fung Shan to the Chung Chi College. The site was given to him by the Rev. Dr. J. Stewart Kunkle who was a former principal of Union Theological Seminary, Lingnam University, Canton. The following lists the lecturers invited for the Pommerenke Lectureship: in 1998 Prof. Wing-hung Lam and Prof. Wai-yiu Wan; in 2003, Prof. Xin-ping Zhuo; in 2004, Prof. Vincent Shen and in 2008, Prof. Bernard Luk.
- e. Publishing the Tolo Theological Series, the Chuen King Series, the Pommerenke Series, the Good Shepherd Series and other theological monographs.
- Collaborating with Christian organizations in the provision of Christian education.

C. Future Plans for Development

We will continue our effort to actualize our departmental mission of "promoting theory-practice integration" in order to serve God and the local churches. In order to face the new challenges, the new trends in theological studies, and the changing ministerial context, we decide to focus our effort on the followings:

1. A New Organizing Framework

The new framework is constituted by the integration of three concepts: providing quality education to our students, conducting research for knowledge development, and using our expertise to serve the Christian community.

2. General Theological Education

Plans will be drawn up to offer more external degrees (e.g. Master of Pastoral Studies, Doctor of Ministry, etc.). Attempts will also be made to meet the needs of local Chinese churches by sponsoring advanced diploma courses to address contemporary theological questions (e.g. feminist theology, political theology, indigenous theology, religious education in Christian schools, mission and communication, ministry and social services, etc.).

3. Refresher Courses for Local Ministers

Refresher courses will be organized to systematically enhance the ministerial competence of the local ministers in the following aspects: general church

management, legal issues relevant to church management, pastoral counseling and workplace ministry.

D. Continuing Education

1. Quarterly Courses

Full-time church workers may apply for permission to attend regular university courses in Theology as "in-service training". Enquiries should be addressed to the Director of Divinity School of Chung Chi College.

3. Advanced Diploma Programme in Theology

Since 2006, Divinity School of Chung Chi College and the School of Continuing and Professional Studies, The Chinese University of Hong Kong jointly organized this programme. 5. Diploma Programme in Christianity and China

Divinity School of Chung Chi College organized Diploma Programme in Biblical Studies since 2010. 6. Theology Training (Ministry) for Laity

Jointly organized with The Hong Kong Council of the Church of Christ in China, Methodist Church, Hong Kong and Divinity School of Chung Chi College, Theology Training (Ministry) for Laity is designed to provide theological training for laity. Course contents include 3 areas: Theological Studies, Biblical Studies and Mission and Pastoral Studies.

7. Refresher Courses tailor-made for Local Ministers

2 to 3 short courses are held annually for pastors and church workers to enhance their competency and quality for serving the churches in this fast-changing society.

X. Biblical Studies and Publications

To cope with the increasing need of Ethnic Chinese reading Chinese biblical books, the Divinity School of Chung Chi College has established in September 1998 this programme so as to promote the publication of Chinese books and resources related to the biblical books. Below are its 3 aims:

- To conglomerate Chinese biblical scholars for the publication of high standard and practical Chinese resources for the study of biblical books, in order to promote biblical knowledge among ethnic Chinese;
- To arouse the attention of the churches the responsibility of research and publication on biblical studies;
- To provide our current and future theology students and pastors with more biblical textbooks and reference tools.

To date, the biblical studies and publications include: 'Christian Extra - Canonical Document - New Testament I to IV' and 'Christian Extra - Canonical Document - Old Testament I to VI', edited by Prof. WONG Kun-chun, published by Chinese Christian Literature Council Ltd. in 2002-2004; 'Biblical and Theological Dictionary of Christianity', edited by Prof. LO Lung-kwong, published by Chinese Bible Interational Ltd. in 2003; 'Bible & Literary Interpretations' and 'Series on Interpretation of Biblical Cutures' (6 books) edited by Prof. LO Lung-kwong and Prof. Liang-gong of Henan University, published by Beijing People's Literature Publication House (人文民學出版社) in 2003 and Beijing Religious Culture Press (宗教文化出版社) in 2003-2005 respectively; 'Biblical Literature and Culture', edited by Prof. LO Lung-kwong, published by Nankai University Press in 2007.

At present, Prof. Wong Kun-chun is working on 'A Greek-Chinese Lexicon of the Greek New Testament' and Prof. LO Lung-kwong is compiling a book on 'Romans Debate'.

XI. Resource Centre for Contemporary Christian Studies

Resource Centre for Contemporary Christian Studies is a teaching and research-based project of the Divinity School of Chung Chi College. Established in 2003, it helps to facilitate the participants to collect data for teaching and conducting researches in Christian Studies, by making arrangements for them to access the five libraries of the Chinese University of Hong Kong, which hold a total of 1.6 million reading materials and more than 30,000 journals.

The Resource Centre provide services to lecturers of universities (or equivalent education institutions) and seminaries in Mainland China such as facilitating relevant materials to lecturers for preparing teaching materials in Christian Studies, which may include a 4-week supervision to assist the lecturers in their preparation to teach these subjects, or perhaps furnish resources for lecturers who may be teaching one or two new courses in Christian Studies. Apart from these, church visits and visits to local Christian organizations can also be arranged as well. Another special service provided includes a 14 to 15-week or 6 months supervision on teaching preparation and research.

In addition, the Resource Centre arranges a 4-week Intensive Summer School every July to August for Master degree or Doctoral degree students in Christian Studies from Mainland China. For the first two weeks, participants attend intensive lectures to ground their knowledge on Christianity. These lectures include "Introductions to Old/ New Testament", "Introduction to Christian Ethnics and Dogmatics". As for the next two weeks (subject to the approved period of visa), participants receive supervision on their individual research study topics. Church visits and visits to local Christian organizations may also be arranged for the participants so as to facilitate their data collection from various sources.

XII. The Centre for Christian Studies

Background

In 2004, the Department of Religion in the Chinese University of Hong Kong expanded to become Department of Cultural and Religious Studies (DCRS). For the period 2005-2006, DCRS has altogether established the Centre for the Study of Humanistic Buddhism, Centre for Catholic Studies, as well as Centre for the Study of Daoist Culture. To keep up with this development, the Divinity School of Chung Chi College (DSCCC), with the support of the Theological Council. has decided to establish the Centre for Christian Studies in the DCRS.

The Chinese translation of 'Christianity' refers to the post 16th century Protestant tradition exclusively and neglects both the Catholic and Orthodox traditions. Our Centre will focus on all these three traditions of Christianity and their dialogue with other faith and religious traditions, which in fact fit the multicultural and religious situation of Hong Kong and China and would contribute more holistically and effectively the understanding of our modern world.

Objectives

- Promoting research related to Protestant Studies in a pluralistic cultural and religious context.
- 2. Enhancing academic exchanges among scholars of various Christian traditions.
- 3. Promoting knowledge of Protestant Christianity and its relationship with other Christian traditions as well as other faiths and religions.

Programmes

1. Scholars Network

To launch a worldwide network for inviting eminent scholars and professors in Christian Studies to come to The Chinese University of Hong Kong to do research, teach and conduct public lectures.

2. University Education

To provide a diversity of programs and courses in the Divinity School of Chung Chi College so as to raise the awareness for research in Christianity in the Chinese University of Hong Kong.

3. Academic Conferences

To coordinate conferences on the relationships between the major Christian traditions and other religions.

4. Journal Publication

To publish academic books and journals with the Christian Study Centre on Chinese Religion and Culture, (CSCCRC- a centre under the auspices of DSCCC) to publish

Ching Feng (in English bi-annually).

5. Public Lectures

To conduct public lectures related to the research of Christianity, wherewith the Chuen King Lectureship as well as the Pommerenke Lectures on Christianity and Chinese Culture with DSCCC.

XII. The Centre for Quality-Life Education

Background

Pragmatism, cost-effectiveness and pursuit of wealth naturally becomes the predominant values in Hong Kong's society, granting her strategic economic status and location in the region. It is inevitable that these values become those of Education as well. Parents and the education system are more inclined to put undue emphasis on the student's intellectual development, academic results and their ability to compete in society, but little attention is paid on the student's personality and development of the whole-person. The recognition of this need has led to an emphasis on life education in recent years. Besides, the current education reform provides a good opportunity to rethink the philosophy of education and its implementation.

The above explains the reason why the Divinity School of Chung Chi College established the Centre for Quality-Life Education in 2010. The Centre works with churches and church-affiliated schools to promote life education in schools.

Mission

1. Promote the Development of Holistic Personality

Encourage churches and church-affiliated schools towards the development of Quality-Life Education, assist Christians and students to pursue truth, nurture of wisdom, and to be connected and co-operate. It will marshal its sources to contribute to churches, society and the welfare of the people.

2. Serve Churches and the Society

Facilitate connections between churches and church-affiliated schools, encourage students to join the Christian community (church), so that they may continue to experience Christ's moral integrity and values. With enhanced attitude to life, the students will contribute to the society eventually.

3. Enhance the Dialogue between Christianity and Different Cultures

Promote rationality and open-mindedness in churches and church-affiliated schools to appreciate our cultural heritage and other humanities subjects so that they are able to understand the similarities between Christian culture and our cultural heritage, and also the uniqueness of Christian faith.

Programmes

 To gather scholars in the field of religious and life education, senior ministers and educators to make analysis and provide suggestions on present situations of religious and life education in Hong Kong.

- To develop research in the area of life education, and life education in church-affiliated schools.
- To organize courses including Diploma Programme in Quality-Life Education, seminars, workshops and retreat camps.
- 4. To produce newsletters and publications on studies / developments about religious and life education

Diploma Programme in Christian Life Education

Since 2010, our School has organized the Diploma Programme in Christian Life Education. The program is to introduce the Christian perspective on life education, and provide training and support to schools, teachers, church workers and youth workers to develop and implement Christian life education. Integrating the socio-cultural context of Hong Kong, the programme adopts an inter-disciplinary approach to learning the growth problems of youngsters and formulating ways to help youngsters develop positive attitude towards life.
