Planning Places for Education and Research

Sites with Immediate Potential

- 1. New Colleges on Residence Lane 1 (Site I)
- Area 39 Northside Research Campus (Site H) 1st Phase
 Remaining phases of development will be planned in due course
- 3. Arts & Humanities Hub (Site E)
- 4. Staff Residences (Site F)

Sites of Intermediate Potential

- 1. Academic Building 1 Southside Outlook (Site C)
- 2. University Station Station Court (Site G)

Sites of Long Term Potential

- Romney Stores Eastside Sports Hub (Site A)
- 2. Open Car Park outside John Fulton Centre Westside Belvedere (Site D)
- 3. Village Path Eastside Outlook (Site B)



Pedestrian Friendly Campus

University Station - platform extension

- Plan for a new northern exit for University Station
- Open negotiations with MTRC to discuss the proposal

New walkways, foot bridges, express lifts

Central Link


New footbridge and express lifts linking up the Student Amenity Centre to the Engineering Buildings are essential

Western Link

New footbridge and express lifts to be planned along with the development of the new colleges.

Eastern Link

Covered walkway, footbridge and stand alone lifts to increase the access to the Mall. Development at Village Path is essential for the route completion.





Pedestrian Friendly Campus

Rearrangement of Bus Routes

- Widen footpaths to facilitate reducing downhill bus stops to encourage walking
- Reconsider bus routes and number of bus stops

Enhancement of Road Network



Park-and-ride

- Build peripheral car parks to allow reduction of in-campus vehicular traffic
- Consider car free zone

Cycle Tracks

 Construct cycle tracks to strengthen connectivity between Area 39 and main campus





Enhancing College Life

Pace of carrying out improvement work to be determined by individual colleges

Conserving Places of Value

- Establish a draft list of places with cultural and architectural significance
- Review the list with experts' inputs periodically

Landscape of Vital Importance

- Establish Management Plan for each of the landscape areas
- Tree and ecology preservation
- Landscape enhancement

Sustainable Campus

Establish guidelines to develop a practically achievable model



IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGIES

The six precepts are the guiding principles in formulating the Master Plan. Each precept will rely on the collective contribution of the others to bring about the full benefits of a sustainable growth in the University campus.

The CMP will be a living and developing document setting out the vision of a plan that would ensure balanced and sustainable development of the University campus. As such, it is not a fixed design but a strategic approach that can respond to changing conditions and which will be reviewed from time to time.
