Consists of 6 villages

Replanned in 2015: from North East New Territories New Development Areas Planning (新界東北發展計劃) to New Territories North Study (新界北研究)

CUHK in Ping Che (中大人在坪拳)

An 8-month on-site participatory learning project, provides students first-hand observation and chances to review the concepts learnt in class (land justice, community-initiated development, equal participation in civil society & the pursuit of good life) 21 CU students recruited (mainly from Arts & Social Science)

Sept 15, 2018

Tour around Ping Che:

A general touch of the villages' physical environment, figured out the local spatial pattern. Induction of the program, raised three main questions:

- 1. What is community/social group?
- 2. What is rural/urban area in Hong Kong?
- 3. What is community art? What are its functions?

Sept 24, 2018

Mid-Autumn Fire Dragon experience:

Participated in the newly-established festive activity held by non-indigenous inhabitants & social activists. Understood how it revives rural cultures, connects indigenous and non-indigenous people, and constructs the identity of Ping Che people.

Oct 6, 2018

Sharing talk by external organizers and social activists:

An introduction of the history of the government's planning and the process of empowering locals to resist the biased urban planning.

Understood more about land justice and why/how they tried to actualize the concepts of civil society in Ping Che.

Oct 20, 2018

Guided tour by expert on local agriculture:

A site visit to various kinds of farms (Aquaponics, Hydroponics & Conventional). Understood agriculture in Ping Che context, including its economic, environmental and social impacts, the difficulties in operation and the functions of farmers' co-op.

Nov 10, 2018

Sharing talk by local farmer and external organizers:

A reflection of the community dynamics.

Learnt from various stakeholders their success, conflicts and difficulties during community building process.

Work in Progress (Spring Term 2019):

To organize a community art festival/ to publish the historical records and stories of Ping Che community.
