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#### Introduction

The undergraduate nursing curriculum is discipline-driven. Some studies found that the use of flipped classroom may help to promote active learning (Missildine et al., 2013; Hamdan et al., 2013).

#### Aims

This project aims to (1) develop micro-modules to facilitate flipped classroom implementation; (2) evaluate students' perception and satisfaction towards the developed micro-modules and flipped classroom teaching in a first-year nursing course, "Fundamentals of Nursing I".

#### Methods

With support from a Micro-module Courseware Development Grant, four micro-modules that cover two major topics were developed. The 2 topics include:



This new approach is good for our learning



#### Micro-modules

#### MMCD 1: Identify intrinsic factors for fall



A four minutes cartoon animation with cartoon character (83-year-old lady) presented with various problems. Students were required to identify her intrinsic factors for falls.

#### MMCD 2: Conduct fall risk assessment

A five minute animation to guide students step-by-step in conducting the "Morse Fall Scale" for a patient.




#### MMCD 3: Identify extrinsic factors for fall in home setting



MMCD 4: Identify various risks that threatened patients and health care providers' health in hospital setting

Both presented in the VR application which included a virtual home or hospital environment.



### Conclusions

The evaluation indicated that the project has achieved its objectives effectively and completely. The findings help to motivate teachers to develop micro-modules and use flipped classroom approach in other courses.
