### Second Meeting (2025-26)

The second meeting in the 2025-26 academic year of the Senate was held on 1 December 2025. The following major items were dealt with at that meeting.

The following programmes were phased out, on the recommendation of the Senate Committee on Sub-degree, Professional and Continuing Education Programmes, with effective dates shown:

The introduction of a Certificate Programme in Psychology and Mental Health at Work with effect from October 2026 was approved.

The recommendation of the Academic Board of The Chinese University of Hong Kong, Shenzhen to change the title of the Master of Arts Programme in Translation and Interpreting Studies (T&I) to Master of Arts Programme in Translation and Interpreting Studies, applicable to students admitted in 2025-26 and thereafter was approved.

The recommendation of the M.D. Sub-Committee to amend the *Regulations for the Degree of Doctor of Medicine* with immediate effect was approved.

The Progress Report on Quality Assurance Council Third Audit Cycle for submission to the Quality Assurance Council was noted.

The 2024-25 annual reports from the following committees/unit, supplemented by the verbal reports of the respective Chairpersons and the University Librarian as appropriate, were received:

The proposed revisions to the University's *Policy on Assessment of Student Learning in Taught Programmes* were approved.

The revised proposal on the Reorganization of the Senate was endorsed for approval by the Council.
