Withdrawal	Students who wish to withdraw from the exchange program will need to inform their home university and NTU Office of Global Education and Mobility (OGEM) to ensure that their academic records and standing are updated.
Academic Transcripts	Upon completion of the Study exchange, two copies of the official NTU transcript will be mailed to the student's home university within two months of the release of examination results. One of the copies will be for the student's retention while another will be retained by the home university. Electronic transcripts are not available.

DOCUMENTS TO PREPARE		
Mandatory documents to be submitted with your online application Submission of hardcopy applications is not required	1.	Latest <u>official</u> transcript in English (signed by the Registrar and stamped with the home university's seal), reflecting all courses taken. Students also need to include a list of current courses (if they are not shown in the transcript). The official transcript and list of current courses should be submitted in one file, in PDF format (<2MB). Postgraduate students would need to include their Bachelor's Degree certificate and Bachelor's transcripts, as well as most recent postgraduate transcripts.
	2.	Clear, coloured passport-size photo in JPG format for your matriculation card. Kindly adhere to the <u>photo guidelines</u> (section iii) as incomplete applications may be delayed or rejected.
	3.	Clear, coloured, scanned copy of your full passport information page The image provided <u>must</u> display all details on the bio-page of the passport. These information must be available as proof of identification. (JPG format, <200kb)

English Proficiency	 Proof of English language proficiency is not required for students who are native speakers of English, or where English is the core language of instruction in the home institution. Below are the guidelines for the level of English proficiency best suited to studying at NTU: 		
	• General Paper of the Singapore Cambridge GCE 'A' Level Examination (sat in 2007 onwards): A, B, C, D, E		
	• General Paper of the Singapore Cambridge GCE 'A' Level Examination (sat in 2006 or earlier): A1, A2, B3, B4, C5, C6		
	IELTS: a minimum of 6 for the Writing sub-test		
	• TOEFL: a minimum of 570 (paper) or 90 (internet) or 237 (computer)		
	• SAT1: a minimum of 600 for the Verbal section; or 7 for the Essay section		
	 IB: a minimum of 4 for Higher Level English or 4 for Standard Level English MUET: Band 6 and a minimum of 50 for writing 		
	• GEPT: High intermediate Stage 2 consisting of writing and speaking modules (applies to students from Taiwan universities only)		
	The guidelines are in place to ensure exchange students are suited to cope with the rigorous curriculum conducted in English. If you do not have any of the tests above, you may request for a letter from your home university, confirming your English proficiency and ability to follow classes in English.		



APPLICATION DEADLINES AND PROCEDURES

Courses Selection	During application, virtual exchange students are required to select <u>at least 5 courses per</u> <u>semester</u> (in order of preference, but only 1 will be approved). Course approval is subjected to vacancies and pre-requisites.	
	 This is to ensure that you have an adequate number of approved courses to take for virtual exchange. Please ensure that the courses you select are suitable for credit transfer back at your home university. Selected courses are subject to approval by the offering Schools in NTU. However, approval does not mean a guaranteed enrolment in the courses, as courses are subjected to vacancies and class/exam timetable. Once approved, you are strongly encouraged not to deviate from the list of approved courses. It is imperative that you select courses which are approved by your home university and are deemed necessary for your academic progression. Requests to reselect courses once registered in NTU will only be processed if there are valid reasons. 	
	UG Courses Selection Please refer to the Virtual Semester Exchange Course List for reference. In your online application, you may select 5 courses as options (only 1 will be approved). The Office of Academic Services will review your selection and assign courses to you accordingly subject to availability and meeting course requirements.
