What is GEF?

General Education Foundation Programme

- Two common core courses required for all undergraduates

> In Dialogue with Humanity

- Reflecting on good life and ideal society

> In Dialogue with Nature

- Exploring the understanding of nature

> Focusing on reading classics

- The Analects, Qur'an, The Social Contract, Republic, The Principia, On the Origin of Species...

Mode of Study in a Week

45 minutes 150 students Lecture Gaining the background and the key ideas

Classics Close reading on their own

105 minutes 25 students Tutorial

discussion Participating in group discussion

60 minutes max. 25 students **Peer Assisted Study Sessions**

A voluntary academic assistance programme that utilizes peer-led group learning to help students succeed

Implementation of PASS (2016-17)

- 23 study groups with 186 sessions in Term 1
- 20 study groups with 199 sessions in Term 2
