## Abstract:

As global population and associated food demand increases, a key objective is to sustainably increase crop production on existing agricultural land. discuss three areas of our recent research that address questions associated 1) How can we increase nitrogen use efficiency in crop with this goal. production and decrease surplus nitrogen and its associated environmental impacts? 2) How large is the impact of surface ozone air pollution on crop yields and how much can future improvements in air quality and development of ozone resistant crop cultivars increase yields? 3) How can agricultural trade be adjusted in ways which reduce water demand without impacting food security?
